Welcome! Voices of faith. Voices of doubt. We hear examples of both in our readings this morning. And sometimes those two opposite voices may spring from the same heart! "Lord, I believe; help my unbelief," pleads the desperate father of a spiritually afflicted boy (Mark 9). Church is a good place to bring our doubts. Speak them to God. Share them with a Christian friend. Doubts do not disqualify us from God's grace in the least. But we should not try to bear them alone. "Let him who walks in darkness and has no light trust in the name of the LORD, and rely on his God." (Isaiah 50)

Because unworthy reception of the sacrament can be harmful, those who are not yet instructed, are uncertain or doubtful, or hold to a different confession should speak to the Pastor before participating.



NEW Sunday Bible Study: How We Got the Bible. This morning we continued a 5-week study called How We Got the Bible. Each week we'll watch and discuss a video by Dr. Paul Maier that answers important questions like: Where did the Bible come from? Who wrote it, and why? Who decided which books to include? What about critics who question its reliability? Participants in this study will gain a new appreciation of God's Word as our primary source of truth and "profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (1 Timothy 3:16b).

A Study of the Psalms - Wednesdays via ZOOM. Join us on Wednesdays at 7:30pm as we dive into the Old Testament Book of Psalms. In this 12-week study, we'll learn how to read and appreciate Hebrew poetry as God's inspired Word. We'll also learn about the different kinds of psalms (e.g. praise, confession, royal, lament) and how they express the wide spectrum of emotions we feel as followers of Christ living in a broken - but still beautiful - world. TAKE IT FURTHER: Today's Closing Hymn, LSB 549 All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name

All of today's hymns, each a familiar and well-loved old favorite, emphasizes the power and majesty of Christ, and His great love for us, sinners though we be. What a joy to conclude our service with the magnificence of All Hail the Power of Jesus' name, written by an itinerant preacher named Edward Perronet in around 1779. It was one of the top-ten hymns by the end of the nineteenth century, evidenced by the number of hymnals in which it appeared. It is a blessing to remember that we join in the everlasting praise of Christ with all Christendom in crowning Christ Lord of all!
