Welcome! How many times in a day do we wonder, "What time is it?" Human beings are timekeepers by nature. We are always using time to help us anticipate things that are to come - whether that's counting the hours until school lets out or the months until we can retire. But how often does God's Word factor into our timekeeping? Isaiah reminds us that this present Creation has an expiration date (Is 51). Jesus teaches his followers how to be ready for the day of his return (Mark 13). And Jude warns us not to take our sins lightly, but praises the One who can keep us from stumbling and present us blameless before Him on the Last Day. (Jude) Our times are in God's hands!

Welcome guests! We are delighted you are with us for worship this morning. 



TAKE IT FURTHER: Today's Opening Hymn: 516 Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying

The theme of Philipp Nicolai's (1556-1608) hymn is the Church awaiting the Bridegroom (Christ) and joyfully announcing His coming! Nicolai was "one of the most zealous defenders of orthodox Lutheran doctrine in the sixteenth century." He lived and served during a time of clashes with both Catholics and Calvinists, as well as a devastating epidemic that brought about the death of more than 1,400 of his town's population of 2,500. In 1599 he wrote a timely book called Mirror of the Joys of Eternal Life based on Romans 8:18 – "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is to be revealed to us." This hymn, as well as the familiar 'O Morning Star, So Fair and Bright" (LSB 395) were included in its appendix. This book left its mark on the German people who felt so battered at their circumstances, and these hymns continue to leave their mark on congregations today.



LAST SUNDAY OF THE CHURCH YEAR

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 51:4-6

- 4 "Give attention to me, my people, and give ear to me, my nation; for a law will go out from me, and I will set my justice for a light to the peoples.
- My righteousness draws near, my salvation has gone out, and my arms will judge the peoples; the coastlands hope for me,

²⁸"From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts out its leaves, you know that summer is near. ²⁹So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. ³⁰Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. ³¹Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

³²"But concerning that day or that hour, no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ³³Be on guard, keep awake. For you do not know when the time will come. ³⁴It is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his servants in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to stay awake. 35Therefore stay awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or when the cock crows, or in the morning—³⁶lest he come suddenly and find you asleep. ³⁷And what I say to you I say to all: Stay awake."
