December 15, 2024

#### **Our mission:**

to spread the Word of Salvation through Christ, honor God, serve others, and grow in faith.

**Welcome!** "Rejoice!" is the traditional theme for this third week in Advent. But there are many reasons why we may not feel much like rejoicing this time of year. Perhaps an overly full calendar, seasonal depression, or missing loved ones has Advent joy feeling like an out of reach dream for you. John the Baptist struggled to find joy in Jesus due to his imprisonment (Luke 7). Yet Jesus assured him that the Savior had come to save his people - not by fixing all our immediate troubles, but by delivering us from our greatest enemies of sin, death, and Satan. In that, we can rejoice!

**Welcome guests!** We are delighted you are with us for worship this morning. Please introduce yourself to Pastor Jon, sign the guest book next to the front doors, and let us know how we can be of service to you. The order of service is printed in this bulletin starting on page 2. A cryroom is available at the back left of the sanctuary for families with young children if there is a need.

**Communion Note:** We believe that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us. Because unworthy reception of the sacrament can be harmful, those who are not yet instructed, are uncertain or doubtful, or hold to a different confession should speak to the Pastor before participating.

#### <u>TAKE IT FURTHER</u>: Today's Distribution Hymn: 359 Lo, How a Rose E'er Blooming

This beautiful and familiar carol dates back to 15<sup>th</sup> century Germany. Its author is unknown. It actually began as a Catholic hymn, which referred to Mary as the "rose that enveloped the Christ Child." However, in 1609 when Michael Praetorius, a Lutheran church musician, included it in his collection of hymns, he altered the lyrics to place the emphasis on Christ and referring to Him as the Rose. It begins with the interjection 'Lo!', calling for the singer to "Look! Pay attention! The prophecy we have waited for is fulfilled!" This is an Advent message that bears repeating.

### Old Testament Reading: Zephaniah 3:14–20

14Sing aloud, O daughter of Zion; shout, O Israel!Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter of Jerusalem!

15The LORD has taken away the judgments against you;

he has cleared away your enemies. The King of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst;
