Baptism of Our Lord

January 12, 2025

Our mission: to spread the Word of Salvation through Christ, honor God, serve others, and grow in faith.

Welcome. We enter the Epiphany season by remembering our Lord's baptism by John at the Jordan River. Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit and announced as God's beloved Son. This Sunday's lessons also invite us to remember our own baptism and how it connects us to the saving work of Christ on the cross.

Welcome guests! We are delighted you are with us for worship this morning. Please introduce yourself to Pastor Jon, sign the guest book next to the front doors, and let us know how we can be of service to you. The order of service is printed in this bulletin starting on page 2. A cryroom is available at the back left of the sanctuary for families with young children if there is a need.

Communion Note: We believe that our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but his very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us. Because unworthy reception of the sacrament can be harmful, those who are not yet instructed, are uncertain or doubtful, or hold to a different confession should speak to the Pastor before participating.





TAKE IT FURTHER: Today's Distribution Hymn, LSB 542 When I Behold Jesus Christ

This recent hymn, written in 1970 by a 16-year-old young woman, comes from Ethiopia, and is "representative of a new style of hymns from the 1960s and early 1970s." At that time, a Swedish missionary to Ethiopia, Aurelia Keefer, said that the only hymns in use there were those that had been brought by previous Swedish missionaries. The Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, a Lutheran body, was planning on publishing a new hymnal and put out a call for new hymns that could be included. 16-year-old Almaz Belihu submitted this one, and the rest, as they say, is history! She actually submitted it, unsurprisingly, in the form of a tape recording, as most Ethiopian music is primarily oral rather than written out. It is representative of authentic African style, using a pentatonic scale and open harmonies.

THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 43:1–7

- ¹ But now thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel:
 - "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine.
- ² When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;
 - and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you;
 - when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you.
- ³ For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.
 - I give Egypt as your ransom, Cush and Seba in exchange for you.
- ⁴ Because you are precious in my eyes, and honored, and I love you, I give men in return for you,
- peoples in exchange for your life.
- ⁵ Fear not, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east.
 - and from the west I will gather vou.

¹What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin that grace may abound? ²By no means! How can we who died to sin still live in it? ³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the

dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. 6We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7For one who has died has been set free from sin. 8Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again: death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. 11So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Holy Gospel: Luke 3:15-22

¹⁵As the people were in expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Christ, ¹⁶John answered them all, saying, "I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming, the strap of whose sandals I am not worthy to untie. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹⁷His winnowing fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

¹⁸So with many other exhortations he preached good news to the people. ¹⁹But Herod the tetrarch, who had been reproved by him for Herodias, his brother's wife, and for all the evil things that Herod had done, ²⁰added this to them all, that he locked up John in prison.

²¹Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened, ²²and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form, like a dove; and a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."
