A Tenebrae Service

I. Jesus is Condemned

Isaiah 53:8 ~ Luke 23:13-25

Psalm 17 (read responsively)

- L: Hear me out, God! Listen to my case: I speak the truth. You be my judgement!
- C: Search my heart; search it in the darkness of night. Test me with fire. See my innocence.
- L: I speak no evil. I have kept Your word, walking steadfastly in Your path.
- **C:** My feet have not stumbled.
- L: I call out to You, God, for You will hear me.
- C: Listen! Hear what I have to say. Show Your great love, O saving God.
- L: Let me flee to You.
- C: Let me be Your beloved, sheltering beneath Your wings, safe from wicked brutes.
- L: My enemies hem me in, craving my flesh. There is no pity in them, only boastful words.
- C: They draw near like ravenous lions, crouched, ready to spring, eyes fixed upon me, eager for the kill.
- L: But my reward is to behold Your face;
- C: It is enough for me to awake in Your presence.

II. Jesus Carries His Cross

Isaiah 53:7 ~ John 19:16-17a

Psalm 55 (read responsively)

- L: Hear me, God! Do not turn away!
- C: Listen! Answer me! Grief cuts me to the core.
- L: See me shudder at the enemy's shouts, at the jeers of the wicked.
- C: Hear their twisted lies and spiteful curses.
- L: My heart quivers, stricken by death's terrors;
- C: Fear has me in its grip, and I tremble.
- L: I pray for wings like a dove to fly far, far away.
- **C:** I would flee to the wilderness and build a nest there.
- L: There I would rest from this tempest, God,
- C: There, far from raging tongues.
- L: It was my friends who turned on me, not some foe I could shrug off, but close friends.
- **C:** We used to pray together.
- L: See their wickedness, God. See how they befriend evil.
- C: I cry out to You, morning, noon, and night. I complain bitterly.
- L: But You have listened, God. You have heard my case.
- C: You break their power over me, saving God. You give me peace.
- L: Take my burdens, God; save me from stumbling.
- **C:** I will trust in You always.

III. Jesus Falls Beneath His Cross

Isaiah 53:2b-4,11b ~ Luke 23:6

Psalm 38 (read responsively)

- L: God, in Your great anger do not chastise or punish me.
- C: Your arrows have struck deep; You hand weighs heavily upon me.
- L: Because of Your rage, my flesh wastes away;
- C: Because of my sin, my bones grow brittle.
- L: I am bent by guilt, burdened by my load; my wounds reek and fester.
- C: Broken by folly, I walk in sorrow, grieving all the day long.
- L: My flesh burns, consumed by fever.
- C: Bruised and stamped upon, I cry out, groaning from the heart.
- L: Lord, You see all secrets, You hear my sighs.
- C: My heart breaks, all my strength has fled, even my eyes grow dim.
- L: Friends shrink from my wounds; relatives keep their distance.
- **C:** Enemies set snares, hatch plots, threaten death.
- L: But I am deaf to their words, silent at their taunts.
- C: I am like one who, hearing nothing, gives no answer.
- L: For it is You I trust, my God, You who can answer them.
- C: Stop their gloating and boasting when I stumble.
- L: God, do not leave me alone. Do not abandon me.
- C: Come, quickly save me, O God, my God.

IV. Jesus is Stripped Isaiah 53:6 ~ John 19:23-24

Psalm 31 (read responsively)

- L: I shelter in You, God; take away my shame.
- C: Save me! Set me free! Listen! Come quickly!
- L: Be my rock of safety, my stronghold, my fortress.
- C: God, my rock, I call onYour name! Lead me! Guide me!.
- L: Untangle me from the net; draw me close to You.
- C: I place myself in Your hands, God, my safety. I trust You; I delight in Your love, in Your faithfulness, O God.
- L: You saw my pain, my wounded spirit;
- C: You saved me from the cage and set me free.
- L: Pity me, God. Grief grips me; mistery strangles me.
- C: There is so much pain the years are filled with sighs. I grow weak! How brittle are my bones!
- L: Enemies hound me down. Neighbors scoff and scorn.
- C: My friends desert mer, avoiding my gaze as though I am a corpse, one of the damned.
- L: But I trust You, God; I am Yours alone.
- C: Let Your love shine upon me, now and always.
- L: Let those who love You know Your embrace. Let them see Your justice.
- C: Teach them to take heart, to trust in You, O God.

V. Jesus is Nailed to the Cross Deuteronomy 21:22-23a ~ Mark 15:22-25

Psalm 25 (read responsively)

- L: I worship You, my God, I trust You; save me from disgrace, from the jeers of my foes.
- C: It is those who break faith who are the fools, not the ones who wait for You.
- L: Show me Your path, God. Teach me, guide me, lead me in truth.
- C: for You are my God. I have waited for You all day.
- L: Remember Your tenderness, Your endless love,
- C: and forget the sins of my youth, my frailties. Because of Your goodness, remember me, God.
- L: You show sinners the straight road, leading the poor to justice.
- C: Those who keep Your law walk in kindness and truth. For the sake of Your name, forgive me.
- L: I love You, O God. Show me the way I should choose, the path of blessing.
- C: You are a friend to those who love You, to those who cherish Your law.
- L: I fix my eyes upon You,
- **C:** for You will set me free from the trap.
- L: Look at me, God; pity me. I am sad and alone.
- C: Lighten my heart, my heavy burden. Heal my festering wounds.
- L: Let me shelter in You. Give me integrity for a shield because I wait for You.
- C: Rescue me, God, from all my troubles.

VI. Jesus Dies on the Cross Isaiah 53:5 ~ John 19:30b-37

Psalm 16 (read responsively)

- L: Keep me, God. You are my safety, my only happiness. I delight in fidelity.
- C: Those who chase other gods bring troubles upon themselves. When they pour out blood offerings and praise the names of idols, I will not join them.
- L: You, God, are all I have; everthing depends on You.
- C: You guide me; You teach my heart, O God.
- L: I will bless You.
- C: I will think of You always, mindful of Your presence, O God my strength.
- L: You will not abandon me or leave me among the dead.
- C: No, You will lead me to life, to endless joy, at Your right hand, forever.
