Welcome Message. "What are you seeking?" Jesus poses this penetrating question in today's Gospel reading. And it's a question we are wise to ponder for ourselves. What is it we are looking for...in this life, from ourselves, from others, and (most importantly) from Jesus? John's words testify clearly who Jesus is and why he came. He is the "Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world"!

Our Lord invites to his table those who trust his words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as he forgives and loves us. Because unworthy reception of the sacrament can be harmful, those who are not yet instructed, are uncertain or doubtful, or hold to a different confession should speak to the Pastor before participating.

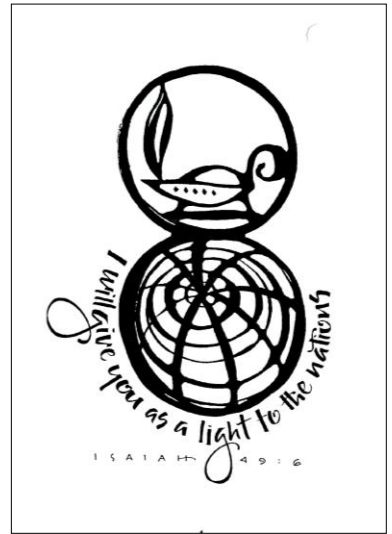

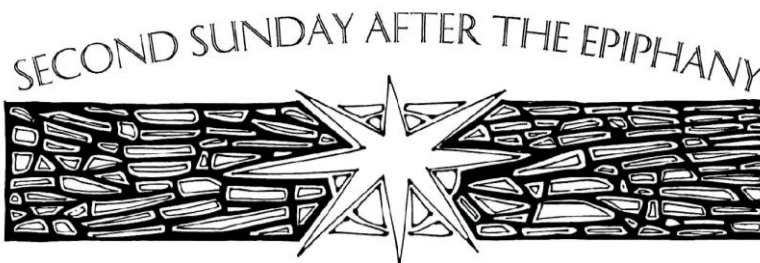

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER THE EPIPHANY

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 49:1-7

- ¹ Listen to me, O coastlands,
and give attention, you peoples from afar.
The LORD called me from the womb,
from the body of my mother he
named my name.
- ² He made my mouth like a sharp sword;
in the shadow of his hand he hid me;
he made me a polished arrow;
in his quiver he hid me away.
- ³ And he said to me, "You are my servant,
Israel, in whom I will be glorified."
- ⁴ But I said, "I have labored in vain;
I have spent my strength for nothing
and vanity;
yet surely my right is with the LORD,
and my recompense with my God."
- ⁵ And now the LORD says,
he who formed me from the womb
to be his servant,
to bring Jacob back to him;
and that Israel might be gathered to
him—
for I am honored in the eyes of the
LORD,
and my God has become my
strength—
- ⁶ he says:
"It is too light a thing that you should
be my servant
to raise up the tribes of Jacob
and to bring back the preserved of
Israel;
I will make you as a light for the
nations,
that my salvation may reach to the
end of the earth."
- ⁷ Thus says the LORD,

to one deeply despised, abhorred by the
nation,
the servant of rulers:
"Kings shall see and arise;
princes, and they shall prostrate
themselves;
because of the LORD, who is faithful,
the Holy One of Israel, who has
chosen you."

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 1:1-9

¹Paul, called by the will of God to be an
apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother
Sosthenes,

²To the church of God that is in Corinth,

to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called
to be saints together with all those who in
every place call upon the name of our Lord
Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours:

³Grace to you and peace from God our
Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

⁴I give thanks to my God always for you
because of the grace of God that was given
you in Christ Jesus, ⁵that in every way you
were enriched in him in all speech and all
knowledge—even as the testimony about
Christ was confirmed among you—⁷so that
you are not lacking in any spiritual gift, as
you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus
Christ, ⁸who will sustain you to the end,
guiltless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.
⁹God is faithful, by whom you were called
into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ
our Lord.

Holy Gospel: John 1:29-42a

²⁹The next day [John] saw Jesus coming
toward him, and said, "Behold, the Lamb of
God, who takes away the sin of the world!"
³⁰This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes
a man who ranks before me, because he was
before me.' ³¹I myself did not know him,
but for this purpose I came baptizing with
water, that he might be revealed to Israel."
³²And John bore witness: "I saw the Spirit
descend from heaven like a dove, and it
remained on him. ³³I myself did not know
him, but he who sent me to baptize with
water said to me, 'He on whom you see the
Spirit descend and remain, this is he who
baptizes with the Holy Spirit.' ³⁴And I have
seen and have borne witness that this is the
Son of God."

³⁵The next day again John was standing
with two of his disciples, ³⁶and he looked
at Jesus as he walked by and said, "Behold,
the Lamb of God!" ³⁷The two disciples
heard him say this, and they followed Jesus.
³⁸Jesus turned and saw them following and
said to them, "What are you seeking?" And
they said to him, "Rabbi" (which means
Teacher), "where are you staying?" ³⁹He said
to them, "Come and you will see." So they
came and saw where he was staying, and
they stayed with him that day, for it was
about the tenth hour. ⁴⁰One of the two who
heard John speak and followed Jesus was
Andrew, Simon Peter's brother. ⁴¹He first
found his own brother Simon and said to
him, "We have found the Messiah" (which
means Christ). ^{42a}He brought him to Jesus.
